BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT AND RELEVANCE TO THIS CONTRACT

Renovation of North, Comstock and Cabot Halls

The project included the renovation of three of the Halls on the Radcliffe Quadrangle campus located approximately 4 blocks west of the Harvard Campus. In addition to the renovation of the existing floors, the attic of both the Comstock and Cabot Halls was recaptured for additional student housing. A new dining hall was also constructed at the base of Moors Hall, which required the removal of the first floor load bearing walls. The entire structure above the first floor was supported with steel beams located under the second floor structure to facilitate the removal of existing load bearing walls at the first level. A new structural system was installed that supported the upper levels and opened up the first level to accommodate the new dining hall and kitchen.
